# May-June 2017 Newsletter Article from our President

I don't know about all of you, but for me this year has really flown by. I can recall planning for my first RNQG Board meeting and last night was my last as your president.

My goal this year was community and communication and I believe that we can say that it was a successful year. One of the first things we did this year was a survey to see what we could do to build on creating a sense of community. Kathy Graves worked with me on the survey and put it into Survey Monkey. Thank you Kathy. We had 47 members complete the survey. Below are some highlights of the survey.

- Wanted to join a community of people with similar interests 72%
- Percentage of guild members that you know 30%
- Since joining this percentage have become friendly with other members of the guild 78%
- Our membership was split evenly when asked the question if they get together with guild members to quilt with others in the guild –yes and no 39%
- Sadly this number had not made friends (hopefully they have this year) 22%
- The favorite part of the meetings are the speakers 76%
- Do you enjoy when our meetings have community interaction 87% yes
- Our members were mixed on the type of speakers and workshops they would like to see brought to the guild –
  each category got between 54-65%
- RNQG is the only guild membership for 62%
- When asked what type of a quilter they are we had a wide variety, hence our fabulous quilt show
- When asked if you ever served on the Board the response was 55%
- When asked if you would serve on the Board 48% responded no. 14% yes and 12% maybe.
- When asked how often you work on quilt projects
  - Most days 37%
  - Weekly 35%
  - Couple of times a month 11%
  - Monthly 7%
  - Few times a year 11%
- When asked some ways we could interact with others the following were the top responses
  - Bus trip to Vermont Quilt Festival 65%
  - Quilt retreat 62%
  - Charity quilting 62%
  - Block of the month 51%
  - Guild challenge 49%

I have tried to address your interests this year. We did ask for a volunteer to run the bus trip to VQG but did not have anyone step forward to run it. Maybe next year it will happen. Without volunteers we can't do some of our desires. The quilt retreat was a success for the second year and we now have 39 quilters signed up for next year. It was such a success that we got 5 new members sign up to the guild from the retreat!

We decided to create an opportunity for members to get together and sew and we now have 6 new Quilting Bees. We will discuss a Bee Challenge next year, which will be displayed at the following years Quilt Show.

Marie Fowler stepped forward this year and we are revitalizing our Comfort Quilting as a group. There is a large group of members meeting on May 6<sup>th</sup> to create comfort quilts and we already have a date scheduled next year during our meeting night to have another. We are building our fabric and batting supplies back up and as you have heard at meetings, please bring in any fabric that you no longer will be using.

I want to thank all of the Board members who volunteered and served this year. Without our volunteers we cannot continue to have our programs and events. Lisa shared a quote with us all at our Strut Your Stuff evening that I think is worth quoting. It is by Sherry Anderson: "Volunteers don't get paid, not because they're worthless, but because they are priceless."

I have already thanked everyone who volunteered for the incredible Quilt Show but want to especially thank Diana Richard and Jane McClellan who did an outstanding job. A huge thanks goes to Abby Sullivan and friends who designed and created a beautiful Raffle Quilt and who raised the most our guild has ever raised for a quilt!

We began the year with 77 members and I am pleased to state that at this point we have gained 10 new members. I hope that we as a community continue to grow and to continue to get to know each other and enjoy our love of quilting together.

## 2017 Quilt Show - That's a Wrap!

With lots and lots of work by many people, I can say our 2017 Quilt Show was a great success. I want to thank all of you who volunteered to help with one (or two or three,) of the committees. I hope you all had a chance to attend and are feeling proud. It was a great show. Our appraiser, who attends many shows, even told us our show is always one of the best of the local shows around. So, pat yourself on the back, feel proud of your guild, and start thinking about what role you might like to take for our 2019 show!

Our quilt show is the prime money maker for two years of programs, workshops, school rental, storage unit, etc. etc.! Every member benefits from the show, whether they have entered a quilt or not. This year our profit for the show was approximately \$8200. This is double our profit of our last show, so you can see, it was very successful financially. Hopefully this means we will not have to do an auction in our 2017-18, but instead will get to have another wonderful speaker!

A few of the financial successes were the raffle baskets which netted \$1700, well over \$1000 more than any previous year; the raffle quilt which netted \$4082 which is about 4 times more than any previous year; and admissions which brought in more people and dollars than any previous year other than the year we brought in the Last Supper quilt. Each of these committees were headed by a chairperson who took their jobs to a new level by thinking outside the box. Many thanks to Angela Dubuc and the baskets helpers, Abby Sullivan and the raffle quilt crew and ticket sellers, and to Judy Schmitt for her outstanding work with publicity. Each of these members came up with new ways to enhance the way their job functioned.

# **RNQG Programs 2016-17**

Our May guest is Riane Menardi, a writer and modern quilter from Des Moines, IA. She will present her lecture:

### Zooming In; Exploring cropping and scale in modern quilts.

In this lecture, Riane Menardi discusses how to "zoom in" on part of a traditional quilt block and transform it into a modern quilt of any size. She discusses the differences between traditional and alternate grid work, and some of the foundational elements of modern quilt design, including negative space, minimalism, modern color palettes and more.

Then on Thursday morning, workshop participants will learn about High Contrast Hand Quilting. In this three-hour workshop, students will try their hand at planned and improvisational hand quilting using large stitches and thick threads like sashiko or perle cotton. They will learn how to apply high-contrast quilting designs to quilts with large amounts of negative space to create movement, motion and focus in a quilt. The technical aspects of hand quilting will be discussed as well as larger design planning and techniques.

There are still spaces available for this class.

If you are already signed up, PLEASE look at the supply list. There is prep work to do. Remember this is only a morning class so we all want to be ready to start on time.

### Our **June** guest is Dr. Peter Kevorkian.

A Doctor of Chiropractic, he will speak to us about how to avoid injury and strain as we quilt. He has asked that quilters take pictures of themselves as they are working. He will use these photos during his lecture to talk about posture and body position in relationship to the machine both while seated and standing. Also, how to relieve the stress of working in one position for hours.


