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#### **Meet One of Our Quilters**

CAITLIN STAHL, age 26

I have been quilting since summer 2018. I made my first quilt with my mom to take with me to graduate school in Edinburgh, Scotland. I was hooked.

My mom taught me the basics of how to put a top together, how to hand-quilt, and how to bind. So one of the first things I did when I had free time was find a quilt shop and buy some fabric. I initially planed to hand quilt every single part of the quilt as I didn't have a sewing machine and wasn't sure I was going to buy one in Scotland. But that October, I decided to look for a cheap machine. I found a shop and bought my first beauty, a 50<sup>th</sup> year anniversary edition of a Janome. I made several small quilts as gifts through out that year in Edinburgh.

When I came home in 2019, I made several smaller projects and got my sister hooked on quilting as well.

This past year, I finally got a step-up step-down converter for my Janome and started using it again. I also learned several new things from YouTube videos, online classes for GenCon, and just taking a leap of faith. I now know how to free motion quilt on my mom's Viking, how to English Paper Piece a guilt, and some nifty tricks about how to cut better. I've made several larger guilts and even

started to design quilts for myself. Overall, I've been hooked and the longer time goes on, the more I'm hooked on quilting.
