Who? What? When? Where? WEBSITE !!!

Whenever you have questions about RNQG activities, the fastest place to find answers is on the RNQG website!

The "**Welcome**" page (the place you land when you go to rnqg.org) has two menus. On the left side of the page is the "main" menu. The contents of this list may change from time to time, but an item that is *always* available is "**Calendar**".

When you click on "Calendar", the next page that appears is the <u>main calendar page</u>. It contains a set of tables, one for each month of the quilting year. The table for September 2021 is shown below.

From left to right, the columns in the table specify: date; event type; time; and details. The lines that have background colors highlight events of interest to all guild members – Open Sew Dates have a pink background; a cream background is used for Guild Meetings.

The "detail" column for a Guild Meeting includes the location, the name of the guest speaker, and the topic of the program. If you want to read a full program description, speaker bio, or see pictures of quilts made by the speaker, you need to navigate to the website page for that month.

There are three ways to get to the website page for September from the main calendar page

- Click on "September" in the menu going across the top of the page,
- Click on "September 2021" above the table for the month, or
- Click on the program topic.

No matter which method you choose, the next page you will see has a wealth of information – including a link to the speaker's website, and (if applicable) the workshop description and link to a workshop supply list.

So rather than call or email the guild president, program coordinator or historian when you have a programming question, hop over to the website -- you might even enjoy the ride!

The focus of tonight's program is an "insider tour" of the 2020 Tokyo Quilt Festival. Patricia presents the highlights of this international quilt event, then continues onto a *chusen*-dyeing workshop to explain the traditional hand-dyeing process. She finishes with a show of her own quilts, made with vintage Japanese cottons, and talks about how these special fabrics inspired her.

Patricia made her first quilt out of old clothes from Goodwill at age 53. Once caught by the quilting "bug", she worked on quilting projects during every free hour (as well as hours she *should* have been working). "I was a fish who didn't know I was a fish until someone showed me the water," she explains.

She discovered vintage yukata cottons during one of many trips to Japan. These hand-dyed fabrics with graphic patterns and luscious colors seemed ideal for making striking quilts. A self-taught quilter, Patricia developed a technique for adding curves to her quilt designs. This piecing approach, called Complex Curves, complements the lyrical designs of the Japanese cottons she uses in her work.

Today Patricia and her daughter Victoria co-own Okan Arts, a cottage business that imports vintage Japanese textiles. Okan Arts offers its remarkable textiles through an online shop and at trunk shows. The company also sells the Sashiko 2—a Japanese sewing machine whose stitches look remarkably like hand quilting.

Whenever she can, Patricia is in her studio creating innovative quilts with Japanese textiles. Currently Patricia is working on a quilt series that incorporates yukata cottons and her newest curved piecing technique—Inserted Curves. The quilt shown in the picture above utilizes this innovative technique.
