A Community of Quilters Quilt Show Update

The quilt show date has been confirmed with the Blue Hills Vocational Technical High School for March 18-19, 2023. It will be here before you know it!

Please continue to finish up those UFO quilts and half-finished class projects. There should be plenty of "Covid quilts" to show as so many of us were confined for more or less two years as well as quilts made while Blue Hills was under construction. We will also be showcasing the quilts we have made during our workshops. There will be a section at quilt show called, "Look What I Made in Class".

We are excited to report that we have filled all of our quilt show leadership positions. Thank you to all who have come forward. As a Community of Quilters, we will support you when you request volunteers as there will be tasks for all skills and abilities. We have met as a show committee and will continue to meet as needed and in smaller groups on Zoom. All chairs have been asked to submit budgets as soon as possible. Mary and Terry will work with Karen LeBlanc on a developing a comprehensive show budget in June.

As our members are attending area wide quilt shows they are coming up with new ideas for our show. At a recent show we saw a new way to attach our labels to the black curtains which will protect our curtains for the future. We also have an idea to have an I Spy Contest for children visiting the show to keep them involved. At another show we saw a way to cut down on filling out raffle basket tickets to save time for people purchasing tickets. If, during your trips to see other guilds quilt shows you see a new idea, please let us know about it.

Summer Challenge: We will be creating 5" x 8" mini postcard quilts. Terry Greenstein has purchased and pre-cut the pelon and made kits with instructions for all. These can be picked up as you check in for the May 18th quilt meeting at the Blessed Sacrament School cafeteria. There will be several examples of these postcard quilts to see at the meeting. These are quick to make and we will be selling them for \$10. It will be an inexpensive way for someone to leave our quilt show with a little piece of artwork. This is one of many ways we can build up our depleted bank account and ensure we will have monies available for exciting speakers in the future!

Publicity: Maura Woodard has already been working on getting the word out and has created a beautiful "Save the Date" card featuring our stunning raffle quilt. There will be opportunities to share these by bringing the cards to area quilt shows and shops. There will also be an on-line version to share virtually.

Diana Richard has started to receive confirmations from vendors after sending out letters to previous vendors and personally speaking to new vendors at quilt shows.

As you can see, we are well on our way to our best quilt show yet! Please continue to look for ways you can contribute.

Postcard/Mini Quilt Directions

Materials needed:

Fusible Web: Pelon Wonder-Under, Misty Fuse or Steam a Seam 2

Heavy Weight Stabilizer:

Pelon 72F Peltex Two-sided Fusible Ultra Firm Stabilizer (Provided by RNQG) Pelon 70 Peltex Sew in Firm Stabilizer

- 1. Cut a 5" x 8" piece of stabilizer. If using Pellon 72F each side is fusible.
- 2. Then begin to create your quilt. You can sew together a scene and then fuse it or if using a background, iron it onto the Pellon.
- 3. If creating a scene, each piece that you put onto the background needs to be fused on using a fusible web.
- 4. Once the design is created, it is time to do some quilting (if you choose). You may want to embellish it with buttons, beads, colorful threads etc.
- 5. Fuse a piece of fabric onto the back of the mini quilt.
- 6. Either sew a binding, finish the edge of the mini quilt with a zigzag stitch, or fuse a binding on the quilt.
- 7. Please sign your name on the back.

When creating the mini quilt think about what might be sellable.

Susan Cleveland Topic: "My Eclectic Quilt Pageant"



This evening, RNQG is thrilled to host Susan Cleveland, one of the world's most enthusiastic personalities for ooo's, aaaah's, and laughter while learning a plethora of tips to increase accuracy and add fresh, interesting details.

Susan's name has been recognized in the international quilting community since 1997. Judges often comment on her "fine workmanship" and "original style". Her quilts are loosely based on traditional designs with a fair bit of unexpected surprises and details because she is apt to "include charming, unexpected elements such as specialty threads, prairie points, piping, and great binding techniques." They always showcase precision piecing, thread embellishments and bold color.

Her program will demonstrate how to take show pieces to new levels and add charming surprises to simple pieces. Susan will share real live quilts with close-ups through the projector so you're sure to see oodles of detail. You may recognize many quilts as winners in AQS Paducah shows and from the International Quilt Festivals in Houston. Don't miss out on this good time!

Susan puts a contemporary spin on the classic Dresden Plate block by using *double* points! This eliminates the need for the traditional appliquéd circle in the center of each circle and allows rings to interlock. The Dresdens are built on a foundation so background fabrics don't show through and, more importantly, they turn out <u>perfectly flat</u>!

Learn Susan's tips for speedily turning wedge points with the Prairie Pointer Tool. At home, you may finish the quilt by quilting the background, then ditch-stitching the Dresdens onto the quilted quilt.

Design possibilities are endless!

Karen Brow-Meier Topic: "Movin' On!"

Karen Brow-Meier, our guest speaker for June, has been a quilt pattern designer and illustrator for over 20 years. She will tell you unequivocally, that "movement" in quilts creates magic.

While color, pattern, and workmanship create beauty, *movement* creates interest and draws people in. It's a guaranteed "wow factor" and adds a certain sophistication. It can be created using appliqué, adjusting a composition, incorporating asymmetrical shapes, and unique border treatments. During her lecture, she promises to show lots of unique ways to create movement often and "with a bit of humor that seems to just delight."

Karen specializes in animal theme quilts with pieced and appliquéd blocks. Her quilts are unique, lively, and happy with a subtle sense of humor. She creates animals with personality over realism. Her work has appeared in national magazines, books, calendars and catalogues, and at AQS, Quilt Market, Quilt Festival, Pacific international and Road To California shows. She regularly collaborates with Hoffman California fabrics for quilt models and new designs.



She has lectured and taught workshops for over twelve years at guilds and conferences across the US, throughout California, and on cruise ships. She relishes the company of other quilters but has found that speaking and teaching virtually have their own rewards and advantages.
