
# President's Message

## **Quilt Show Update**

We just received an update from Karen LeBlanc that we have raised \$610 from advertising in our show booklet that Maureen McEntee and Ines Arismendi have created. We will have 14 venders at the show. Hopefully we will all find something that we like at their booths. Stephanie Valanzola has made 28 raffle baskets and we believe that once we receive items from the vendors we will have two more baskets! Dottie Sullivan and Jacqui O'Brien have truly embraced their new position as Boutique cochairs. They have documented everything that we need to know about getting our items ready. It sounds like we have a large number of members participating in the Boutique. I'm sure we will all find some items that we must have. Carol Coakley truly did an incredible job putting together a team that designed the beautiful raffle quilt and then found venues to sell tickets. She and Carla Keen are now working on the next raffle quilt. AnneMarie Freitas managed the registration of over 150 quilts and created documents from the data base for all of those who needed the information. The users of those documents included Anita Loscalzo and Zelayna Rauch from Quilt Central who sent us all our quilt tags that must be put onto our quilt labels. Diana Annis has created the layout and design of the quilt show, Janet Elia made the labels for the quilts, Maureen used the information for the booklets, and Terry Greenstein will use it for the voting and ribbon awards. AnneMarie also from afar was able to send Terry the photos of the quilts so that they could be used in a TV program that was set up by Maura Woodard, our Publicity chair, and filmed on Canton TV with Maura, Carol and Terry promoting the show. We filmed both a PSA and a segment of Up to Speed for the Canton audience. Canton TV will also be attending the show and filming it. How great is that for guild publicity!

Along with her presidential duties, Lisa has been putting together the list of volunteers for the show. We need everyone who can help come to set up, white glove, sit at the various tables, and break down the show. Jane McClellan is back in the guild and she rejoined just in time. As many of you are aware, Mary Peterson is very ill and needed to step back from her duties. Jane was there to step into a role that Mary had done in previous shows which is working with the Blue Hills boosters in getting meals made for the vendors. The boosters will also have food available to sell to those working and visiting the show.

This year we have decided to not only display our beautiful comfort quilts at the show but also raffle off three of them. Terry Ruta has been busy gathering some quilts and has worked with our incredible Sue Crane who has donated three auction quilts. The proceeds from the quilts will go towards materials needed to create new comfort quilts. Kathleen Yorkis and Lisa have been busy getting the signage ready for the show. We will have our large signs hanging in front of the school.

"Buck a Block" is back and Karen has once again gotten Andy from Anne's Fabric to donate the use of sewing machines so that people can try some quilting to see if they

like them. Margaret Rolph will be nearby at the membership table with the hope of getting new members.

AnneMarie has also put together a photo montage of our past workshops so people can see who we are and what we have learned in the past. Venera has put together a poster showing the future programs for next year which also should attract new members. She is also in charge of breaking down the show. Laura Rosenspan will be putting together a scavenger hunt sheet for young or old visitors to the show. She also will be providing a docent experience for visitors both on Saturday and Sunday. As you can see, we have all been very busy this past year making this a fabulous show.

I believe that you all are aware that the bags that were purchased are NOT strong enough for large bed quilts. Please put your large quilts into sturdy bags and label them with your name and quilt number so that we will return your quilt in the bag in which it was received.

A reminder that if any of you still have mini quilts (5 x 8" postcards) please bring them to the Wednesday meeting. And finally, once this show is over it is time to begin to plan for the next one in two years. We will be looking for two guild members to step up as cochairs.

And finally let's all remember to send healing messages to Mary as she recovers from this nasty illness.

Summer Celebration of New England Quilts at New England Quilt Museum The Best of the Region's Quilt Guilds

#### August 15 – September 9, 2023

The Summer Celebration of New England Quilts will feature a gallery exhibition of exceptional quilts made by the New England Quilt Museum's Supporting Guilds. Our guild is invited to submit one quilt, to be selected by our membership at our April meeting, for inclusion in this special exhibition. The quilts will not be judged at the exhibit, but a Viewers' Choice Award will be presented. The winning guild will be invited to display its members' quilts in the Genre Gallery of the New England

Please review the following instructions if chosen:

- 1. Entries must consist of two layers of fabric with a middle layer of batting. It must display quilting by machine and/or hand. Quilting is defined as a running stitch that passes through top, batting, and backing. Tied quilts are not permitted.
- 2. NEQM will not accept entries made prior to 2020. No kits please.

- 3. NEQM reserves the right, for whatever reason, to reject any guilt submitted.
- 4. Due to limitations in the Museum's gallery space, quilts should be no larger than 80" wide and 88" long, but no smaller than 24" wide and 24" long. Quilts will be hung as space permits.
- 5. All quilts, regardless of size, must have a 4" hanging sleeve sewn to the upper back of the quilt.6. All quilts must have a label on the back with the title, guild name, quiltmaker's name, address, and phone number.
- 6. In addition to the completed quilt entry form (given to owner of RNQG quilt), NEQM requires two photo images of the quilt: (1) view of the entire quilt, (2) close-up showing the quality of the stitching, piecing, and/or appliqué. Method #1: E-mail two JPEG images to <a href="mailto:director@nequiltmuseum.org">director@nequiltmuseum.org</a>

- JPEG images must be identified with the guild name. (For example, "XYZ Guild. jpg" and "XYZ Guild detail .jpg")
- Images should be in sharp focus and reflect the true color of the quilt.
- Digital images will not be returned and may be used for educational and/or publicity purposes. form, please indicate that in the e-mail message containing your images.

Method #2: Mail printed photographs (4"x6" or larger) with your completed guilt

Entry Form (page 3).

- Mark your guild name ON THE BACK of the photo.
- Indicate using arrows the top of the guilt
- Images should be in sharp focus and reflect the true color of the quilt.
- Photographs will not be returned and may be used for educational and/or publicity purposes.
- 7 All entry forms must be postmarked no later than Tuesday, June 6, 2023
- 8. All shipping costs to and from the New England Quilt Museum are the responsibility of the owner.
- 9. Quilts must arrive at the Museum no later than Wednesday, July 19, 2023.
- 10. No quilt may be withdrawn prior to the close of the exhibition, Saturday, September 9, 2023
