Summer Challenge

Quilted Hearts for Veterans



Quilted Hearts for Veterans will be distributed at the Irreverent Warriors Silkies Hike in Worcester on September 30, 2023.

Size: 3 to 4 inches. Recommended Colors: red, white & blue, Military branch specific colors or prints are(navy, olive)..

Front should be pieced, appliquéd, embroidered, or embellished . The back should be one solid piece of fabric.

A 2" to 3" ribbon, twine, or fabric loop should be attached to the top of the heart so it can hang from a pack. No personal message.

Attach a small paper string tag pinned with a small safety pin stating something like, "Lovingly made by Rhododendron Needlers Quilt Guild. That would be welcome.

Deadline: all hearts are due at our first meeting - September 20th and no later.





Irreverent Warriors, Inc. is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization (EIN:47-4789126) whose mission is to: bring veterans together using humor and camaraderie to heal the mental wounds of war, through therapeutic events and entertainment, in order to reduce PTSD and prevent veteran suicide. According to the VA's Suicide Data Report, 2012 study, 22 veterans a day are taking their own lives. This statistic, however, may be a gross underestimate as only 23 of the 50 states participated.

The Silkies Hike was created to fit an unmet demand for veterans to bond with other veterans, to relive the sense of brotherhood and family felt while in the military. During the 2023 season, over 90 hikes will bring thousands of veterans together across the United States. Veteran and military participants hike anywhere from 8-14 miles, some carrying heavy packs, some in wheelchairs, but all in a spirit of support and camaraderie with a singular mission - to eliminate veteran suicide. Veterans normally hike wearing only their combat boots and "Silkies", traditional military physical training shorts full of nostalgia that help promote an environment of humor and camaraderie.

2024-2025 RAFFLE QUILT -- HUNTER'S STAR

For those of you who might not know, our next raffle quilt it will be the Hunter's Star! It is a beautiful quilt that can be constructed with or without a Deb Tucker RapidFire Hunter's Star ruler. We are asking for donations of fabric from members. Then there will be kits with fabric and instructions provided for guild members who sign up to make blocks. We are hoping for at least 30 members to participate.

Here's how you can help!

- 1. DONATE FABRIC We are looking for 1/2 yard or larger medium or dark blue cotton or batik fabrics to be brought to the May meeting. If you cannot attend but want to donate please email us for an alternate plan. Please wash the fabric before donation.
- Please label the fabric if you would like it back in the event it is not used for the quilt; otherwise it will be donated for comfort quilts.
- 2. SIGN UP FOR A KIT If you haven't already done so at the March meeting or via email, please sign up for a kit. Just respond to emails sent out or email directly to HunterStar@rnqg.org. to let us know if and when you want to participate. Kits will be given out at the June meeting and at all of the workshops.
- 3. SIGN UP FOR A WORKSHOP We have 4 workshops scheduled and will schedule more over the summer if needed. You may attend more that one workshop if seating is available. As above, you can sign up via email to HunterStar@rnqg.org directly or by responding to emails we have sent out. Please bring usual sewing supplies, sewing machine and optionally a cutting mat, a rotary cutter, an iron and ironing pad. There will be cutting and ironing stations available. Optionally bring potluck appetizers to share. At the workshops there will be demos and time to get started, on (perhaps finish?!?) your kit.

There were questions on the RNQG 2023 Survey about posting on the RNQG FB page and setting up Notifications. The RNQG FB page is public and open to anyone who has a FB account.

The RNQG FB group is private and only open to RNQG members and interested former members. It is restricted to members only by an administrator who must approve entry into the group. Any member of the guild, who is a member of the group can post on the page.


Posting on the group page is similar to posting on your personal page. Look for the RNQG symbol in the feed. In the space that asks, "Write something..." write your message. You can add a photograph by clicking on "Photo/video". You can add a link, as well. In order to know when something new has been posted on the RNQG FB page or RNQG Group page you must turn on notifications. These

notifications occur in the application only. In other words you will not receive a text or email to inform you of new postings. Notifications will be listed under the bell in the top right corner in FB.

Red and Cream Comfort Quilt Blocks Call for Volunteers.

As a guild we created 145 red and cream blocks. Amazing! Members made anywhere from 2 to 20 blocks. Now they need to be sewn together. There are enough blocks for 3 quilts. The finished blocks should measure $8\frac{1}{2}$ ". Each quilt will be composed of 48 blocks with 6 blocks to a row and 8 blocks to a column. They should each measure about 51" x 68".

The blocks will be available at the next meeting. If you can't make the meeting, and you want to sew a quilt top together, please let me know and we can arrange for you to pick up the blocks at All About Quilts. What a terrific summer project for anyone who is willing and able!
