<u>Labels</u>

This is the last bit on your quilt that answers all the questions. It's the one piece of information that will tell your story in its entirety and is the one element most often deleted. I'll show you the who - what - why - where and when of making a creative, fun label. I believe this is the most important part of a quilt, besides finishing it! There are no limits to your creativity when it comes to a label. No size, shape, or concept limits. Just imagine!

Supply List

- Your quilt(s) to label
- Leftover or coordinating fabrics for your quilt(s). (Include some light colors for writing/printing on.)
- Coordinating threads, this may be for applique, seaming and/or embroidery so have a variety
- Scissors
- Pins
- Preprinted labels (I have many I will bring)
- Printer with standard paper (I will bring one)
- Computer/Laptop
- Fabric Pens, you'll want a variety of colors and sizes (i.e. thicknesses)

My favorites are Gelly Roll (thin and medium point) and Pigma Micron (various sizes, even brush tip)

Bring what you have, I have many to bring.

- Fabric printer sheets
- Freezer paper
- Iron
- Pencil, fine point. (I like Bic mechanical as they keep their fine tip)
- Light Box, if you have one

I know this sounds like a lengthy supply list. But I also know that most of this is what we already have. I'm detailed so you will have it at hand. Once you have made a few you'll find that you'll make them before the quilt is finished. It is a completely addictive and fun process!

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
